

Tiki-Toki Timeline Exercise

- 1.) **Create an account** at <http://www.tiki-toki.com/>.
- 2.) Spend a few minutes **reading through the FAQs** at <http://www.tiki-toki.com/faqs/>. Pay particular attention to the FAQs under “Creating a Timeline” and “Creating a Story.”
- 3.) Navigate to “My Account” and click on “**Create a New Timeline.**” Your timeline will be inspired by the Rule of Law Oral History Project interview you listened to for today. Include a title and some brief introductory text. Your start and end dates on the timeline will be the date the interview took place. See my sample timeline here: <http://www.tiki-toki.com/timeline/entry/425922/The-Rule-of-Law-Oral-History-Project-Moazzam-Begg/>.
- 4.) Use Wikimedia Commons (http://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/Main_Page) to **search images in the public domain** for the intro image and the background image. As you identify images you might like to use, click the blue “**More Info**” button to find information you can include in the credit fields for the intro and background images. Input images and credits, and be sure to save.
- 5.) Navigate to “**Create New Story**” under “Admin.” (For this exercise you will create only one “story,” though for a final digital project you would create several stories on your timeline contributing to a narrative or argumentative arc.) Include a title and intro text that discusses the significance of the interview (feel free to draw from the results of your Close-Listening Worksheet). Include the video of the interview by navigating to the “**Story Media**” tab.
- 6.) E-mail me the link to your Tiki-Toki timeline.
